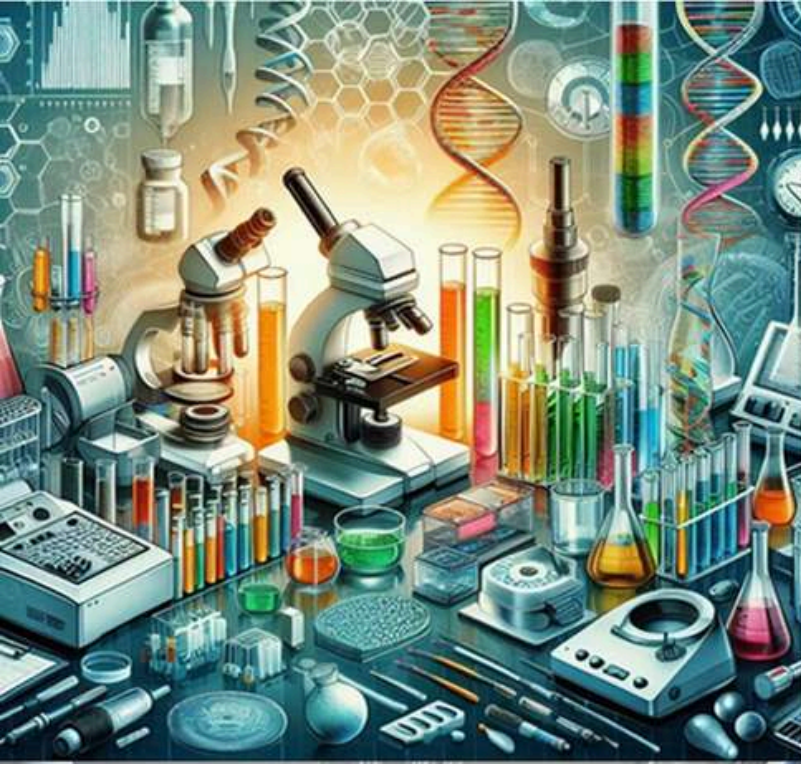

## Performance Management System Information Meeting

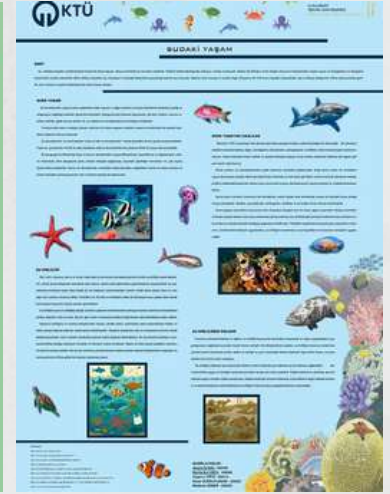
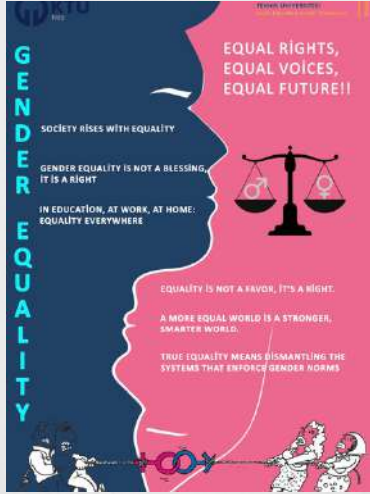

## E-Newsletter Feedback Evaluated

### E-NEWSLETTER ISSUE 1 FEEDBACK SURVEY RESULTS AND EVALUATION

The results of the E-Newsletter Evaluation Survey indicate that the vast majority of participants \*actively follow the e-newsletter\* and \*evaluate it positively overall\*. When examining access methods, \*web-based reading\* emerged as the most common, followed by \*mobile devices\*, demonstrating strong digital accessibility.

More than half of the participants expressed positive opinions regarding the timing and adequacy of announcements; however, the notable proportion of “partially” responses suggests that announcement processes could be made \*more visible and more regular\*. The content—particularly academic activities and student events—was largely found to be suitable for participants’ needs.

Regarding the preparation of the e-newsletter in \*both Turkish and English\*, the vast majority of participants evaluated this practice positively, indicating that the bilingual publication policy is both accurate and inclusive. High satisfaction levels were also observed in terms of visual design, page layout, and accessibility, with “satisfied” and “very satisfied” responses predominating.

In terms of content length and readability, the e-newsletter was generally considered appropriate, with only a limited number of participants finding it “slightly long.” Concerning content engagement, a significant portion of participants stated that they read the information either completely or partially, demonstrating that the e-newsletter has attention-grabbing content.

While most participants reported no perceived quality difference between the Turkish and English versions, the presence of some undecided respondents suggests that minor improvements in translation and language consistency could be beneficial. A high proportion of participants stated that their level of knowledge about the vocational school increased after reading the e-newsletter, confirming that it \*fulfills its informative function\*.

However, the more evenly distributed responses regarding whether the e-newsletter increased willingness to participate in events indicate that its motivational and directive aspects could be strengthened. A significant number of participants noted areas for improvement, highlighting the importance of continuous enhancement based on feedback. The prominence of the “rarely” response regarding reading frequency suggests that reviewing content frequency and presentation format may be beneficial.

**In conclusion,** the findings of the E-Newsletter Evaluation Survey demonstrate that the e-newsletter is a \*successful, informative, and positively received communication tool\*. High satisfaction is particularly evident in content quality, bilingual publication policy, visual design, and readability.





## E-Newsletter Feedback Evaluated

With that in mind;

- \* Making announcement processes more effective,
- \* Structuring the content in a more encouraging way to increase participation in events,
- \* Developing a variety of titles, formats and content to increase reading frequency

will increase the corporate impact of the e-newsletter. Regular evaluation of survey results and transformation of feedback into concrete improvements will contribute to the development of the e-newsletter as a sustainable and effective corporate communication tool.

### E-NEWSLETTER ISSUE 1 IMPROVEMENT EFFORTS AND IMPLEMENTATION RESULTS

To increase visibility, readership, and participation in events, announcement processes, content structure, design, language use, and feedback mechanisms were improved through a holistic approach.

#### • Improvement of Announcement Processes

A planned, multi-channel communication structure was established. An annual publication calendar was created, and announcements began to be shared simultaneously via email, the web portal, and social media platforms. Short, clear, and effective headlines were used to increase visibility.

#### • Making Content More Encouraging and Participation-Oriented

A content structure that encourages reader action was adopted. Visually focused event sections were created, and the benefits and ease of participation were emphasized with concise texts. Student activities were highlighted to create a warmer and more motivating tone.

#### • Increasing Reading Frequency and Engagement

The newsletter was reorganized into a modular structure with short headlines and clearly separated sections. Thematic areas such as Research, Student Activities, and Cultural Events were expanded to appeal to diverse interests. Mobile-friendly, visually oriented design was maintained, and interactive elements such as mini surveys were introduced.

#### • Strengthening Language and Translation Quality

Consistency in content and terminology between Turkish and English versions was ensured through regular translation checks and quality control processes. Technical and academic terminology was standardized in both languages, offering clearer and more consistent content for international readers.



## E-Newsletter Feedback Evaluated

### • Establishment of the Feedback Cycle

In order to support the continuous development of the e-newsletter, a systematic feedback mechanism has been established. At the end of each issue, short feedback surveys have been included, and the collected data have been analyzed regularly. Concrete improvements made in line with reader feedback have been announced in subsequent e-newsletters, and a transparent development process has been adopted.

### • Monitoring and Evaluation

To measure the impact of the improvement efforts, survey and feedback analyses are conducted every six months. The e-newsletter's reach, readership, and participation rates are monitored regularly, and the publication schedule and content plan are updated in accordance with the obtained data. Through this approach, the e-newsletter's level of interaction and effectiveness in institutional communication has been sustainably increased.
